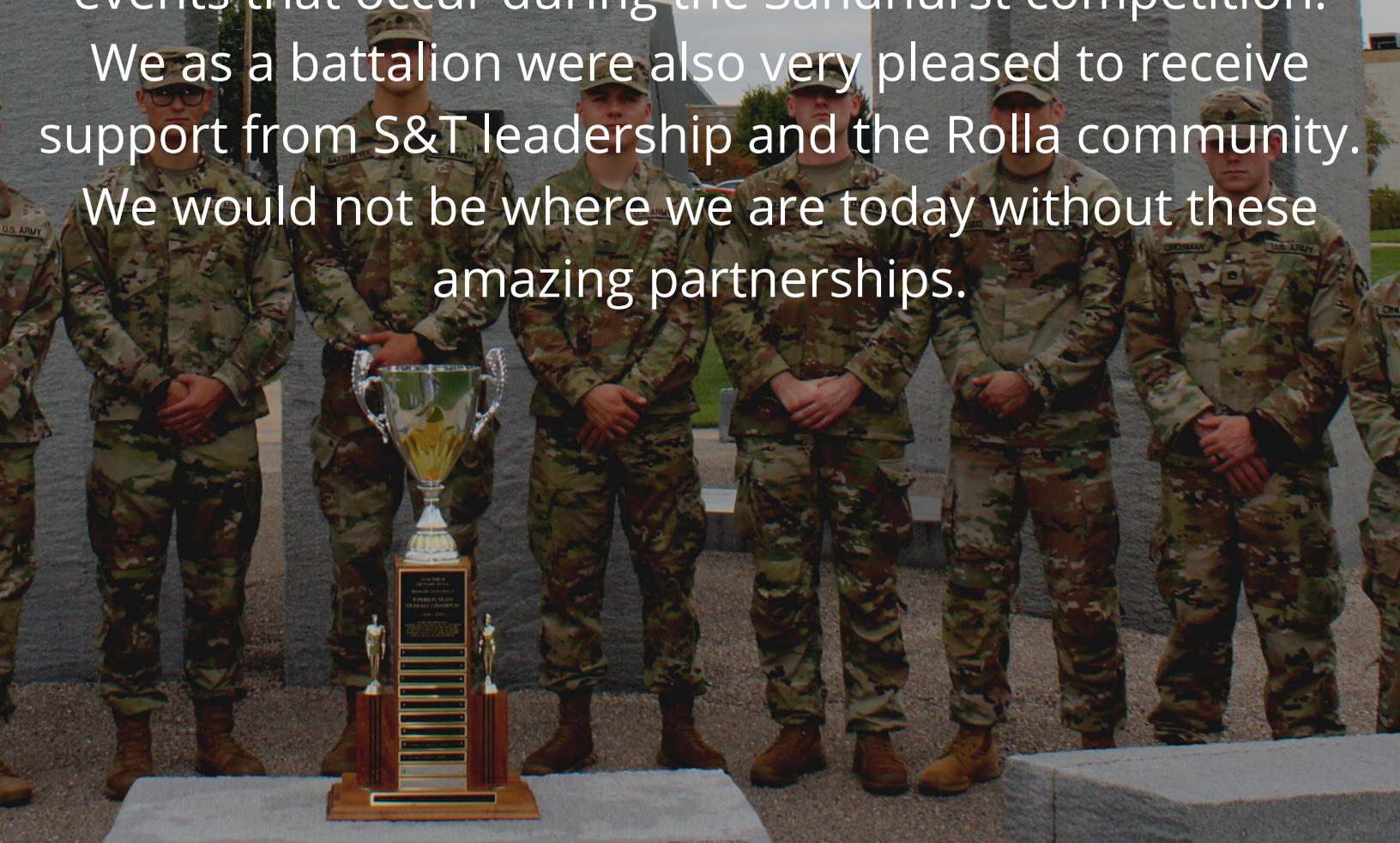
Overview

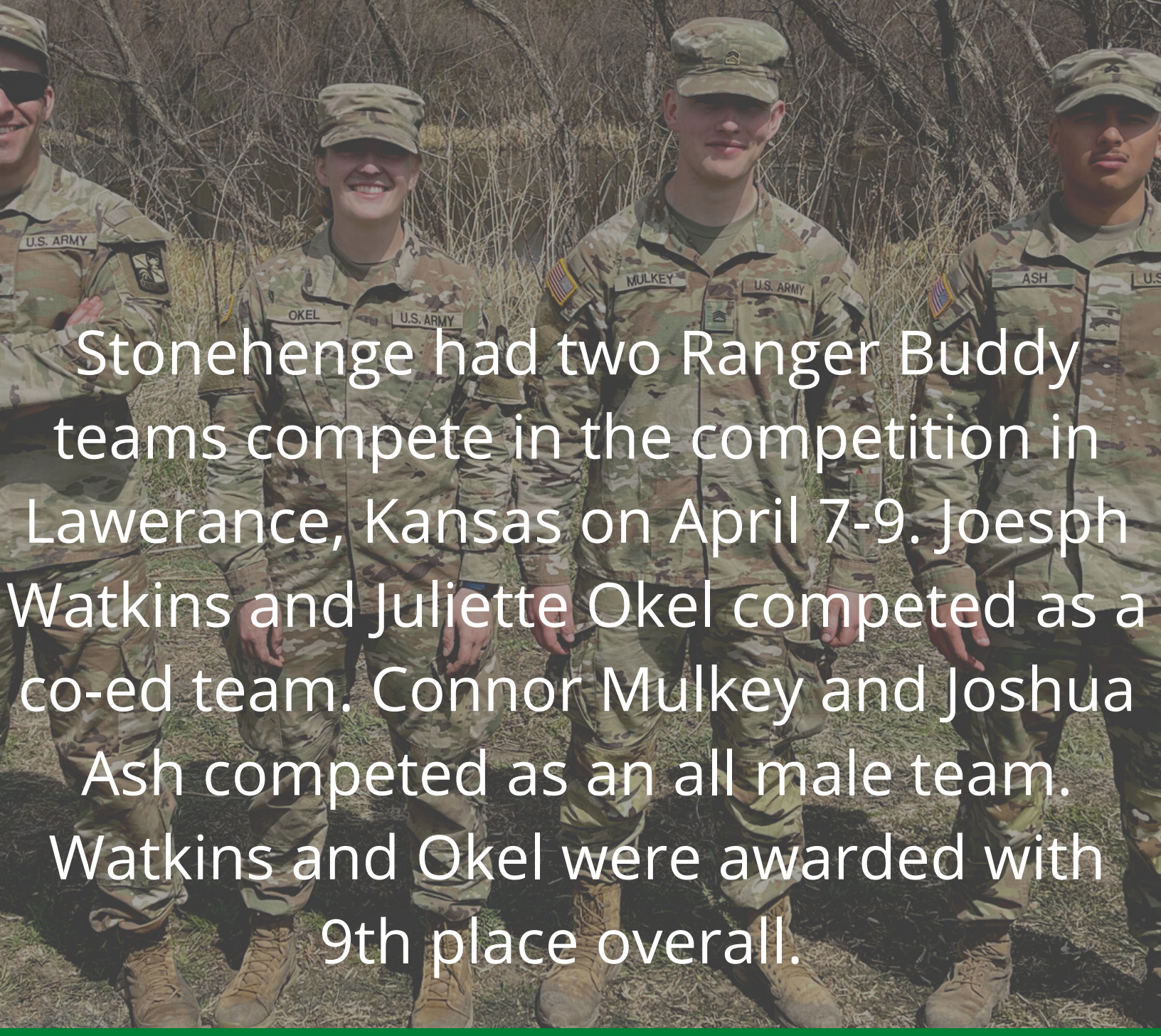

Although all our cadets performed great, Cadet Kleinschidt stood out and was awarded the top MS3 Cadet by Cadre.

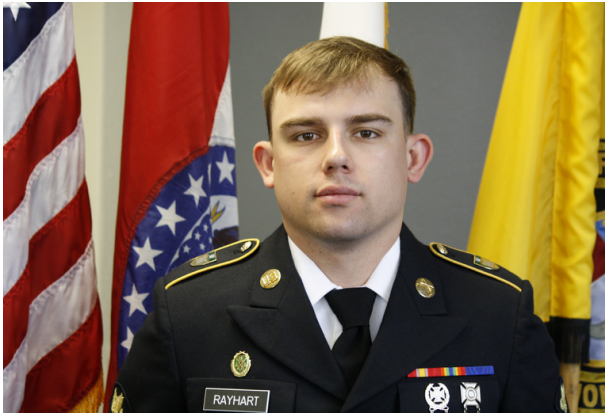

Commissioning

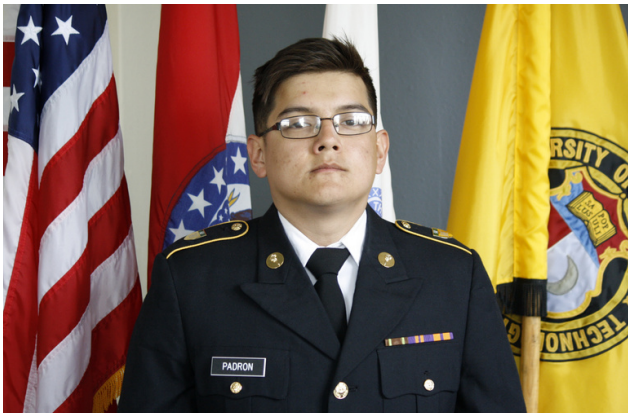

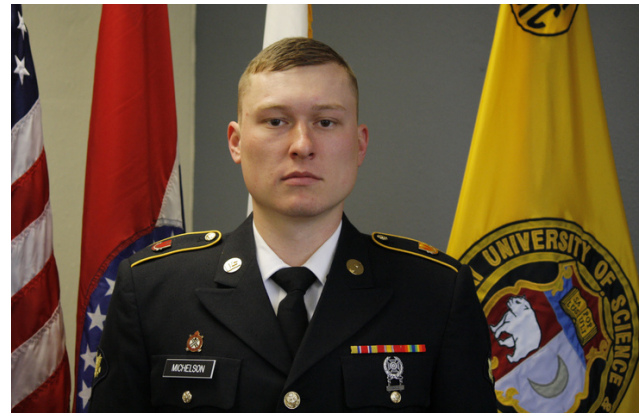

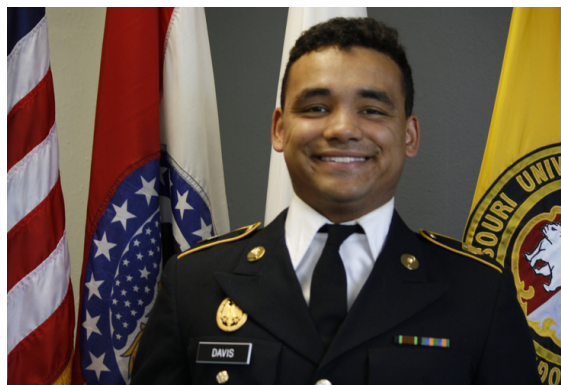
